	<p><u>Abraham Lincoln</u> =</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > 16th President of the United States. > Freed the African-Americans from slavery. > Lead the country through the Civil War.
	<p><u>Lincoln Memorial</u> =</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Building in Washington, D.C. in honor of Lincoln. > If you look closely, you can see a tiny version of the famous statue of Abraham Lincoln sitting.
	<p><u>Thomas Jefferson</u> =</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > 3rd President of United States. > Writer of the Declaration of Independence. > Architect, philosopher, farmer, inventor
	<p><u>Monticello</u> =</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Jefferson 's home, which he designed. > Located close to Washington, D.C.
	<p><u>Franklin D. Roosevelt</u> =</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Franklin Delano Roosevelt was one of America's most popular and influential Presidents. > Lead us through World War II > First handicapped president.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > a torch, an olive branch, and an oak branch
	<p><u>George Washington</u> =</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > First President of the United States > Hero of the Revolutionary War.
	<p><u>Eagle</u> =</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Symbol of the United States
